Overall Objectives

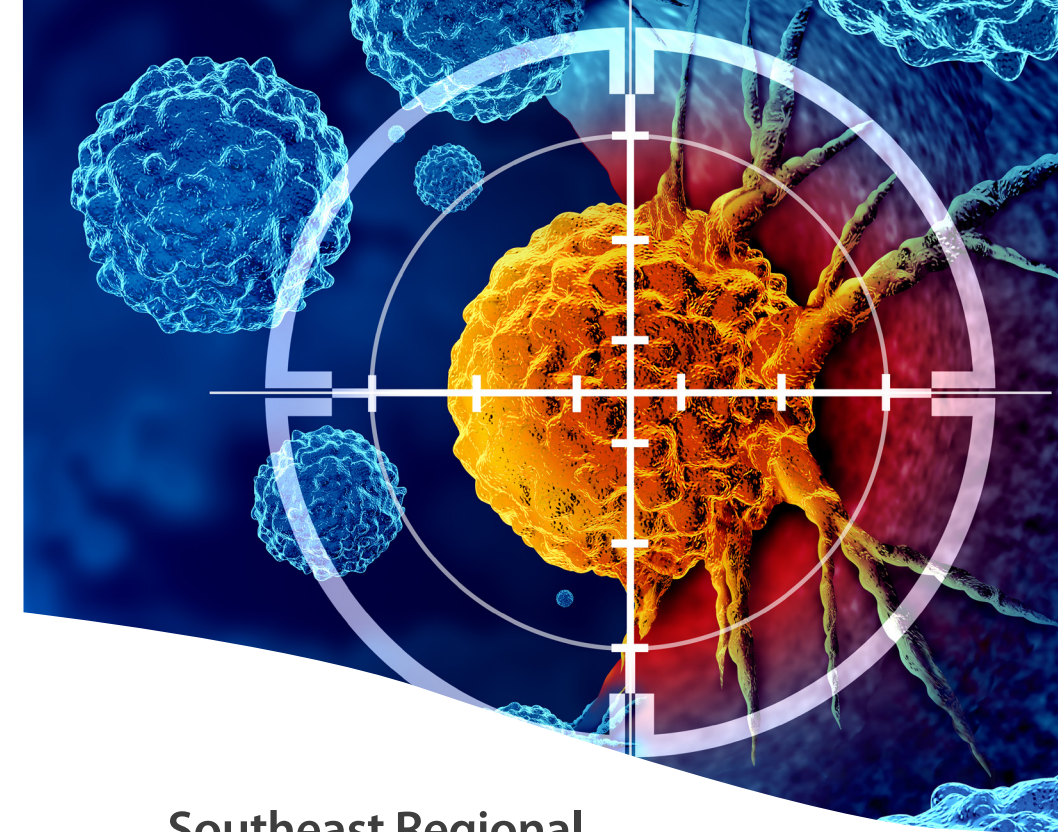
At the conclusion of the learning activity, participants should be able to:

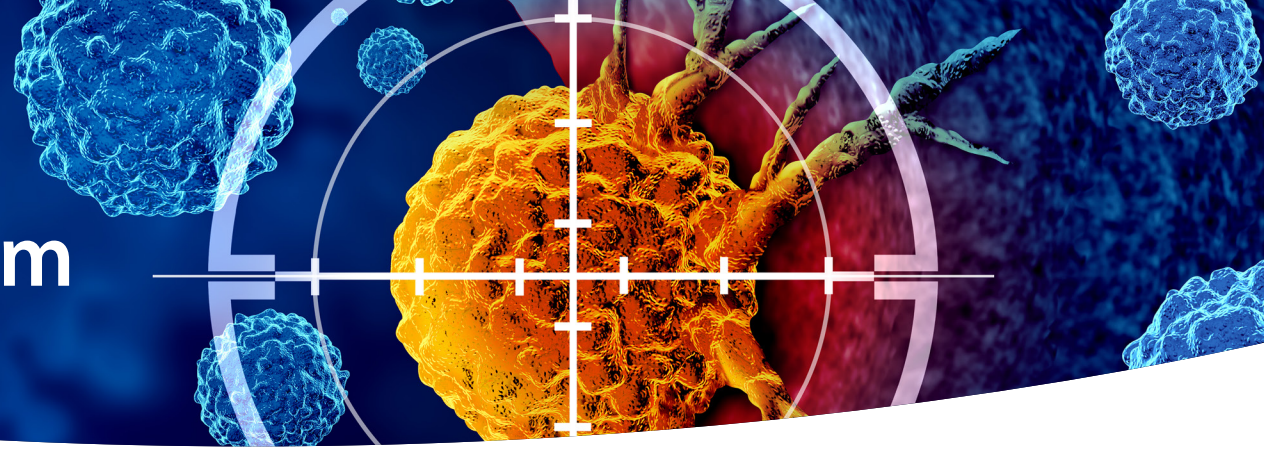
