A physical exam is essential, even if my mammogram does not show any abnormality. Although mammography is the most reliable test for detecting breast cancer when it is early and still too small to feel, a mammogram does not detect all breast cancers.  This exam may cause temporary discomfort in some patients due to the amount of compression necessary to obtain proper images. This compression does not in any way damage breast tissue and it produces no long-term discomfort. I understand that I should receive a notice of the results of my mammograms in about 2 weeks and that if I have not received it in that time, I should call Memorial Breast Services at 423-495-7752.
